John 1:1-18

**Intro:** Entering Christmas thru classical Christmas clips...

- Last week, the Grinch...a heart issue at the heart of Christmas (Mt.15:19-20, Jer.17:9).
- This week, "misfit" nature saves the day...
  -The "misfit" of the God-man Jesus!

#### Read: John 1:1-18

- v.1—John's beginning is "in the beginning"...
  - A prologue that pronounces the paradoxical nature of God...
- v.2-5—A light that cuts thru darkness better than a beaming beak...
- v.6-8—A herald to announce a King's coming
- v.9—Jesus' light can ignite others...
- v.10-11—Shut out of "reindeer games"...
- v.12-13—Entering into another nature...
- v.14-18—Misfit nature of Jesus: "Word became flesh"


### Scripture on Jesus' Nature

- John 1, Colossians 1, Hebrews 1, etc...
- Nicene Creed: "... God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made..."

# The Meaning Behind This "Misfit"

- 1) Important for S
- Can't redeem what you can't match (Heb.2:14).
- 2) Important for U
  - God understands the human condition (Heb.4:14-16).
  - Humans can understand God by watching Jesus (Heb.1:3).
- 3) Important for M
  - Mystery of the Incarnation reminds us the truth of Christmas can't be boxed in! (cf. Lk.2:18)

# 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of Advent: Peace



"Strange, isn't it? Each man's life touches so many other lives. When he isn't around he leaves an awful hole, doesn't he?"

[Jesus speaking] <sup>4</sup> Remain in me, and I will remain in you. For a branch cannot produce fruit if it is severed from the vine, and you cannot be fruitful unless you remain in me.

5"Yes, I am the vine; you are the branches. Those who remain in me, and I in them, will produce much fruit. For apart from me you can do nothing.
