Read: John 16:33

- "Jesus speaking": earned the right to speak into suffering as the Suffering Servant (cf. Is. 53ff.).
- "in me": the prescription for pain...
- "may have": possibility/potentiality for peace...
- "in this world...trouble": life's guarantee...
- "but take heart": contrast and courage...
- "I have overcome...": Jesus defeats suffering. -Good Friday yields Easter Sunday!


The Bible on Suffering

- Passages of Biblical Principles: Acts 14:21-22, Ex.3:7, Ps.119:50, Rom.5:1-5, 8:17-18, 12:2, 2Cor.1:3-5, 4:17, Jms.5:10-11, 1Pet.4:12-13
- Passages of Biblical People: Paul, Job, Daniel, Joseph, David, Heb.11 list of faith/suffering, etc.

- "you will have trouble" (Jn.16:33)...it's promised!
- No longer in Eden...
- Preparation and handling adversity...
- 2) E_____ of Suffering
- Trials aren't a trail we walk alone...Jesus and many others (cf. Heb.11:35ff.).
- 3) E_____ of Suffering
- God's at work in suffering and will one day end suffering...

*Psalm 119:50 talks of God's promises preserving us in suffering. Is there a Bible passage that has spoken to you in the midst of suffering before? What's the verse and what was the occasion it spoke to you thru?
