Lessons Learned from Samson—Part 2

1) 14:5-10


- Acting out of impulses and secrecy lands Samson often in danger...
- Adam and Eve's first act after sin was secrecy (fig leaves and hiding behind trees).
- Living life transparent/out in the open...

2) 14:2-3,7,16, 15:2

- Samson's story...what NOT to do with women...
- Faith void in his decision making process (cf. 2Cor.6:14-15)...
