Intro: Two key pivots in David's plot: 1) Goliath (1Sam16) 2) Bathsheba (2Sam11-12).

• Effects in wake of affair (2Sam.12ff.)... -Forgiveness and consequences...

13:1-2—Echoes of Bathsheba incident...

- David's family tree and family dynamics...
- v.3-4a—"crafty" isn't always good: be careful who your kids allow to speak into their life!
- v.4-6—Jonadab's plan to trap Tamar, and David's lack of dialogue with his son...
- v.7-14—Rape within family and nation...
- v.15-22—Responses to rape: Amnon, Absalom, David, Tamar...
 - Anger but not action (v.21)...unaddressed issues becoming larger issues!
- v.23-29—"pressing" dad, revenging brother...
 - Family dysfunction and danger for David!
- v.30-39—Report, remorse, refugee...
- 14:1-33—Absalom's return home and "reconciliation" with David...
- 15:1-6—Absalom's rebellious course...
 - David's silence to it all...
- v.7-12—Rebellion and revolution...
- v.13-16—David forced to flee from his own city...
 - David's concubines and consequences (cf. 2Sam.13:10-12, 16:20-22)...

Small Group TReflection Questions (Please take time to ponder and pencil in to prep for this week's small group session.)

*What words of counsel/comfort could you offer to the wounds of Bathsheba and Tamar in the wake of 2 Samuel 11 and 13?
